History

HealthLINE was created in 1989 with the merger of two existing health science library organizations; the Metroplex Council of Health Science Librarians (formed in 1972) and the Dallas-Tarrant County Consortium of Health Science Libraries (1978). HealthLINE, like its founding organizations, continues to provide forums to exchange information.

Meetings

The group meets four times a year, each time in a different library, for a business meeting and program. The meetings provide opportunities to develop and maintain resource sharing projects and enhance communication and cooperation among health sciences librarians. During the program sessions, members share information on new trends and technologies.

Organization

HealthLINE includes both institutional and individual members. Officers are elected in the fall to serve during the next calendar year. The Chair, Chair-Elect and Past Chair serve one-year terms; the Secretary and Treasurer serve two-year terms.

Benefits

- Professional development and continuing education opportunities.
- Professional interaction and personal contact with other health science librarians in the area.
- Opportunities to visit other libraries and to become familiar with their collections.
- Promotion of interlibrary cooperation in programs, services, and resources, including free interlibrary loan among institutional members.
- Forum for communication with regional and national health library organizations, such as the National Network of Libraries of Medicine (NNLM).

Awards & Scholarships

The **HealthLINE Travel Award** defrays expenses that recipients incur while attending the South Central Chapter/MLA annual meeting. The number and amount of awards may change annually, and recipients are required to report on their experience at the next HealthLINE meeting.

The **HealthLINE Librarian of the Year Award** recognizes a current member who has demonstrated significant accomplishments in medical librarianship, either in their home library or that directly benefit HealthLINE and its members. Other considerations include service to the profession, current activities, achievements in medical library work, and the impact, visibility, and recognition of that work.
